



NAGC 3 month Summer Internship

NAGC's 3 month summer Internship Programme is a brilliant opportunity for you to work for a national charity. As an intern, you will gain important skills, meet new people and gain valuable experience and training. A summer internship with NAGC is also a chance to put something back into society in an area of charity work which is often misunderstood and neglected – support for gifted children and their families.

All interns will be offered a personalised scheme of work in line with their areas of interest, existing skills and the current requirements of NAGC. Interns will be given a choice of options involving various areas of charity work; for example, fundraising, marketing, finance, helping to draft policy, etc. There may also be opportunities to take on a research project.

We require our summer interns to work a minimum of 3 days a week. Much of the work can be done remotely; however, you will be required to visit Head Office in Milton Keynes once a week. All reasonable travel expenses will be paid.

Whilst as a charity we cannot pay you a wage, we offer a range of other benefits for your time and involvement with us:

- A customised training programme that can take you from department to department to learn about different aspects of working for a charity or enable you to focus on one area of interest or expertise
- A specific project for you to work on where YOU can make a real difference
- Training to enhance your skills
- The opportunity to have an influence on the national policy agenda
- The chance to work in a lively, enthusiastic and committed team
